

Pentecost 2014

On Sunday, June 8, 2014 we will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost – 50 days after Easter Sunday. This is the day when we remember the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles in Jerusalem. This gift empowered them to leave their locked rooms, and go out into the streets of Jerusalem, telling people about Jesus. Their outreach to Jerusalem, Judea, and eventually the known Roman world, formed the Church.

Pentecost is the Church's birthday! At coffee hour, after the 9:00 am service in the Parish House we will have cake for everyone. Plan to join us for this celebration of the Church's formation, our acolytes' ministry, Holy Baptism – and the continuing mission of Trinity Church.
