experience. Aaron is extremely grateful for this experience and is very thankfully all the members of Trinity Episcopal Church.




All are invited to the Gene Clay Memorial Pancake Supper, *Tuesday, February 28, 2017* 5:00 to 7:00 pm.

On January 1, the Catholic Church celebrated the Solemnity of Mary. Mary has always had special meaning to me. Some of it has to do with special people in my life. My mother, maternal great-grandmother, and maternal great-aunt are all named Mary. My long-time friends are Maria, Maryalice, and Marialaina. Three of the first people I met at Trinity were: Mary Katharine, Mary Helen, and Mary Carrick. Of course, my daughter is Marina. Some of it has to do with my religious studies. As a cradle Catholic, the Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus, was the focus. Of course, there are a number of other biblical Marys including Mary Magdalene, the sister of Lazarus, the wife of Cleopas, the mother of John Mark, and a Christian in Rome who was kind to Paul, but Mother Mary has always fascinated me.
