Peace be with you

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord (John 20:19-20).


Many commentators agree that these were the last words Jesus spoke on the night before his crucifixion and possibly in the same room he had the last supper. These same words he spoke on the night before his crucifixion and now after his resurrections are considered as shouts of victory and an outpouring of the blessings upon his disciples. These are words that dispels gloom and ushers in the victory over death and sin.

These same words of Jesus, we use them in our liturgies every Sunday as we gather to worship the Lord. But why are these words or greeting important? Harmon Smith, in his book, "Where Two or Three Are Gathered: Liturgy and the Moral Life, says that "we are not naturally friends of God and people of peace." Therefore these words invites us to "learn to be Lovers of God" or to be friends with God. He further says that, "A greeting, we think, ought truthfully to convey what is meant to conveyed and not something else which is, in fact, false. "Say what you mean and mean what you say," we say. A greeting is a promise that I am truly, in this or that way, as I present myself to you to be."

Therefore from Pentecost, hopefully to advent, we will devote ourselves to a spiritual journey in which we will study the book of Acts with hope that we will "learn to be lovers of God" or to be friends with God because he calls us his friends.

Safeguarding God's Children: A new diocesan policy will go into effect Sept. 1. All church personnel, including all paid personnel, vestry members, Eucharistic ministers, and those working in ministries involving children, must be trained in Safeguarding God's Children. A training session open to the northern convocation will be offered Aug. 12, 9am -12pm, at St. MaryAnn's. Trinity will offer a training session for our parishioners and that date will be announced soon. Safeguarding God's Children is a nationally recognized program for the prevention of child sexual abuse in the church and in the home. It was developed by Church Pension Group and Praesidium Religious Services. The program provides participants with the information they need to protect the children they know and care for in their personal lives and in the ministries in which they serve. The program is based on the philosophy that if every adult can protect just one child, they will forever change one life. If we can all change one life, together we will make a difference in this generation of children.

Sunday School for Children

(age 4 through 6th Grade)

We are excited to announce a plan for Children's Sunday School. It is flexible so that we will always have something to Christian offer when we have families with children. If there are children attending

the service, the ushers will signal Fr. Nicholas by moving little chairs from behind the choir stalls to center. After the Gospel, the children will be invited to move to the little seats and Fr. Nicholas will provide a brief sermonette for the children. They will then be dismissed for an activity in the Parish House (Sunday School room). (We will soon have laptops to be able to access an on-line, age-appropriate curriculum.) The acolyte will retrieve the children during the Prayers of the People and lead the youth back to Mass where they will help during the Presentation of the Gifts.
